Arrangements for the end of term on Friday 17 July 2020

The school term will finish for our key workers' groups at 12.30. We have enjoyed having these students at school over the past few months and hope that they too have enjoyed the experience.

You will be aware that on 2 July the Department for Education (DfE) published detailed guidance for the full reopening of schools from the beginning of the autumn term. This guidance is on the government website (www.gov.uk).

The guidance asks schools to balance and minimise any risks from COVID-19 while providing a full educational experience for our young people. It is a legal requirement that we have revisited and updated our risk assessment, building on the practice that we have already developed during the lockdown, such as teaching students in 'bubbles' for example. Our revised and detailed risk assessment is on our website www.astleycooper.herts.sch.uk under Latest news (9 July).

In planning for a full reopening in September, our main consideration has been for the safety and welfare of our whole community – students and staff.

The guidance makes it clear that schools should keep students in the smallest groups possible. We have therefore decided to set up year-group sized bubbles, which will help to minimise contact between students as much as possible. While it is not possible to provide a totally risk-free environment, we are taking a range of precautions to protect our school community.

Our assemblies will be for single year groups. The year groups will be taught in different blocks or parts of the school, have staggered start and finish times, and different breaks and lunchtimes, as you can see on the timetable below. They will move to other specialist areas for their practical lessons such as design and technology, dance, PE and food technology. There will be a one-way system and students will have their own designated social areas.

Arrangements for the start of the autumn term – September 2020

Tuesday 1 September and Wednesday 2 September are staff training days. Students are not expected in school.







Thursday 3 September Year 7 and Year 12 only:

Year 7 students should arrive at the main gate - Gate A - at 8.20am and will remain in school until 3.00pm. (Gate A is the main gate and Gate B is the service gate at the far end of the top playground.)

Please leave your child with us at the gate and do not to come into school with them. For health and safety reasons, you will not be allowed on site without an appointment.

Year 12 students should arrive at 9.00am and will remain in school for most of the morning

Friday 4 September Year 7, Year 8, Year 12 and Year 13 only:

Year 7 should arrive at Gate B at 8.20.

Year 8 should arrive at the main gate - Gate A - at 8.40am and the Sixth Form should arrive at 9.00am.

Monday 7 September

All other students (Years 9, 10 and 11) will return to school at the times and gates set out in the timetable. Please note the staggered start and finish times and the gates to be used by the students. *These start and finish times will remain as they are here until further notice.*

You will see that we have a staggered lunch break every day and that each year group will have a 30 minute slot, therefore it will not be possible for any student to leave the school premises to go home for lunch. If this causes a particular issue for your child or your family, please contact Mr Daddow, Senior Assistant Headteacher, to discuss it further.

I would also ask you to note the following:

- ➤ Attendance We are looking forward to welcoming all our students back to school in September. Attendance will be compulsory again from the start of term
- Uniform Students are expected to be in full school uniform, including blazers and the correct shoes
- ➤ PE lessons Students must wear their Astley Cooper PE kit all day when they are timetabled for PE
- ➤ **Equipment** the guidance recommends that students have their own equipment, such as pens and pencils as equipment cannot be shared. We would recommend that everyone have two pens, pencil, rubber, sharpener, green pen; in addition, it is useful to have a glue stick, coloured pencils and a highlighter
- ➤ **Appointments** If you wish to see a member of staff, please phone or email to make an appointment. If you have a query that can be answered over the phone, the member of staff will return your call within a working day
