


Winter Festival

The bonus here was we got to collect their eggs which we would take back to kitchen to have for breakfast.

In teams, we would take turns to make breakfast, lunch and dinner for everyone and we would always sit together for our meals to appreciate all the hard work put into making them. Each evening, we would go on a long walk, come rain or shine, and a highlight was walking in the rain through a river and knee sliding down a huge hill.

We would get involved in lots of other activities on the farm, such as apple pressing (the juice was so lovely to have with dinner!), gardening and working in the greenhouses, vegetable picking, herding the sheep, wood chopping, and some arts and crafts.


We made some amazing friends in the team and everyone came away learning some really important things about themselves and lots of new skills.



Sixth Form News

The end to another long and busy term in the Sixth Form.

Year 13 students have been working towards the UCAS deadlines; lots of students have already finished and sent off their applications and have received offers back from universities which is fantastic. The final UCAS deadline is 31st January for applications and references to be submitted.

Year 13 have also worked incredibly hard during the mock examination period and a mock results day will happen when they return from the Christmas break. Students will find out their results as well as get information on what would happen in August on results day with their university choices.

There are BTEC and LIBF examinations happening in January which will be counted towards the students' final grade. All students have been issued a timetable and one will be emailed out via parent mail. Students need to ensure that they are fully prepared for these exams and are revising throughout the Christmas break.

Year 12 visited the University of Hertfordshire on Friday 24 November organised by the Widening Access team. The interactive "Wayfinder Day" allowed our students to immerse themselves in the world of higher education, gaining invaluable insights into their Post-18 options. During their visit, our students had the chance to connect with current university students, take a comprehensive campus tour, and participate in interactive quizzes. They also delved into important topics like student finance and the support available at university. The day was a fantastic opportunity for our students to begin contemplating their future paths and make well-informed decisions about higher education. We are grateful to the University of Hertfordshire's Widening Access team for making this experience possible. Our students are now one step closer to embarking on their Post-18 journey with confidence.

Next term, we look forward to starting our new recruitment process for Year 11 students joining the Sixth Form with our Open Evening and Discovery Day. Letters will be emailed home with more information regarding these events.

A few reminders of our expectations as we go into a new half term.

Uniform - Students should be wearing smart business wear, no hoodies, trainers (including Air Max) or leggings. Students will be sent home to change if they are not in the correct dress code.

Absence from school - If students are not going to be in school, we need to be informed of the reason by 8:45am from a parent or guardian. Truancy calls will be sent out for any students who we can not account for in school.

Study Periods - It is the expectation that students are working during their study periods in either the silent study room G44, group work room G45, in the library or in the canteen which are also quiet spaces. Year 13 students have the Seminar Room to work in as a silent space. Students will have work given to them by their teachers, but should also be using this time to revise using the strategies given in form time, consolidate notes, use the reading list to find books to read or research into their topic area.

Home study - Students should only be going home for home study when it is their allocated time. This is also a privilege and any students who are not doing the right thing, need intervention or support in lessons, have low attendance or are consistently late to school will have this removed.

We would like to wish all our Sixth Form students and their families an enjoyable Christmas period and look forward to the New Year.

Year 13 Geography Field Trip

On Tuesday 12 December, our merry band of Year 13 students, Mr Daddow and I went to Great Missenden to carry out fieldwork in preparation for their summer exam and coursework. We studied the changing nature of Great Missenden by conducting traffic counts, pedestrian counts, environmental quality surveys and sustainability surveys at three sample sites through the village. We also investigated the experience of people who lived in the village by asking them questionnaires, which allowed the students to practice their fieldwork skills with members of the public in Great Missenden. We spent time looking at the local surroundings with a walk through the village to the local church, to view the area of outstanding natural beauty where Great Missenden is situated. The students and staff all had a great day, even though it was wet in the afternoon.
